



FINA 2022 WORLD CUPS ADVISORY

1. EVENTS

- 1.1. Athletes and coaches are advised that all 2022 World Cup entries for British athletes have to be submitted by an athletes' national federation (i.e. British Swimming). Therefore, athletes wanting to compete in any World Cup event in 2022 (subject to 1.2 below) need to formally apply for permission from British Swimming to participate.
- 1.2. The 2022 World Cup series will all take place in 25m pools (short course) and comprise:
 - **Meet 1 (25m)** – Berlin (GER) 21-23 October
 - **Meet 2 (25m)** - Toronto (CAN) 28-30 October
 - **Meet 3 (25m)** - Indianapolis (USA) 3-5 November
- 1.3. British Swimming may select a squad to attend one or more of the World Cup series. If a squad is selected, the size and make up of this squad will be at the discretion of the Head of Performance Development.

2. APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- 2.1. Athletes should apply for permission by:
 - i. Sending an email to Adam Clarke at adam.clarke@swimming.org with the following details:
 - The meet they wish to participate in
 - Reason for attending World Cup meet(s)
 - Individual events they wish to enter and their entry time
 - Long course best times for the above events
 - Details of how their participation fits within their performance plan for the 2022/23 season
 - ii. Email requests should be accompanied by a passport scan (photo page) and passport photograph, received by no later than:
 - **15th September 2022 for Meet 1**
 - **15th September 2022 for Meet 2**
 - **22nd September 2022 for Meet 3**
- 2.2. British Swimming is under no obligation to approve requests to participate.
- 2.3. Athletes not participating as part of a British Swimming selected squad, are advised that if their application is approved:
 - They will need to make all their own logistical arrangements, including travel, accommodation, entries etc. on a fully self-funded basis
 - There will be no support staff from British Swimming attending any of the clusters/legs
 - They will need to attend the FINA Technical meeting for the respective meet they are attending
 - They are responsible for any fines resulting from any withdrawals not in line with FINA World Cup procedures
- 2.4. The following minimum consideration times provide a guide on the performance level that would ordinarily be supported. Times must be included on the British Rankings (www.swimmingresults.org) and have been set **since 1st January 2022**.

Applications from athletes not meeting the consideration times will be considered on the strength of their submission.

Please note that the World Cup event programme has not yet been published but it is anticipated that this may not include a men's 800m Freestyle or women's 1500m Freestyle. Entries for the 50m Breaststroke, 50m Backstroke, 50m Butterfly and 100m IM for all Clusters will only be considered for those approved for an event in Table 1.
